## Gender-Based Work Stress in Internet Companies from a Life Course Perspective

Abstract: Along with the rise of work stress in the development of Internet industry, especially in the context of female labour still shouldering the work and family double burden, gender-based differences in work stress requires attention. In particular, for women who are at the bearing age, family-based division of labour, the organization's gender-based strategy and individuals' gender awareness are important contributing factors to their work stress and hence, key storylines to explain the constitution of gender-based differences in work stress.
